## The Principle

Conceived in 2006 by the artist Joëlle Gonthier, *La Grande Lessive*® is a biannual international cultural event, which takes the form of a **temporary art installation produced by one and all.** 

- By adopting the principle of hanging up washing as the primary method of display, La Grande Lessive® proposes to develop social bonds through artistic practices.
- By means of several thousand simultaneous installations worldwide over the course of a single day, the goal is to bring together the creations (and, in a way, the personal effects) of a family that never knew it existed. Since the project's inception, several thousand people of all ages and backgrounds have already taken part, in 100 countries spanning 5 continents.
- Twice a year, washing lines are hung in or outside the sites chosen by local collectives: learning institutions, art schools, town halls, museums, traditional and multimedia libraries, hospitals, retirement homes, outdoor centers, community centers, businesses, housing estates, public squares, streets... On the day of *La Grande Lessive®*, participants are invited to use clothespins to hang a 2-dimensional creation (drawing, painting, collage, photomontage, photography, visual poetry, digital artwork...) for a period not exceeding the designated day.
- No need to be an artist! This initiative invites creativity and brings generations together.
- Acting together, at the same time and in different places, with common objectives and equipment, is what makes an œuvre.
